COURT INTAKE REOPENING

LOCAL RULE 1017- CHAPTER 13 DISMISSALS OR CONVERSIONS

Local Rule <u>1017</u> outlines the procedures for seeking dismissals or conversions in chapter 13 cases. Dismissals under 1307(b) cannot be done ex-parte, and must be brought on negative notice. See the LR below:

- (a) **Conversions under § 1307(a).** If a debtor seeks to voluntarily convert a chapter 13 case pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1307(a), the debtor must file and serve the assigned chapter 13 trustee with a notice of conversion.
- (b) **Dismissals under § 1307(b).** If a debtor seeks to voluntarily dismiss a chapter 13 case under 11 U.S.C. § 1307(b), it may be brought on negative notice as described in <u>LR 9014.1</u>.
- (c) **Dismissals or conversions under § 1307(c).** If the assigned chapter 13 trustee or another party in interest seeks conversion or dismissal of a chapter 13 case under 11 U.S.C. § 1307(c), the chapter 13 trustee or other party in interest must file a motion to convert or dismiss, set the motion for a court hearing, and serve the notice of the motion and hearing upon all required parties in compliance with LR 9014.

DEMAND FOR JURY TRIALS

Pursuant to LR <u>9015</u>, a demand for jury trial must appear immediately following the title of the complaint of answer containing the demand, OR in another document as may be permitted by Fed. R. Civ. P. 38(b). Any notation on an adversary proceeding cover sheet filed under <u>LR 7003</u> concerning whether a jury trial is, or is not, demanded does not constitute a demand for a jury trial under these Local Rules.
