# SUBSTITUTION OF ATTORNEY

Local Rule 2014(b) requires an order for a substitution of attorney. This order may be submitted ex parte if the substitution is signed by the client, the withdrawing attorney AND the substitution attorney. If the withdrawing attorney is disbarred, suspended, or no longer in good standing to represent the client, the attorney's signature is not required for the substitution. Otherwise, the request for substitution will need to be set for noticed hearing.

## **REMOTE HEARINGS**

The U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of Nevada continues to conduct hearings remotely. Hearings are held by telephone or video conferencing, unless otherwise ordered by a judge.

#### REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON PROPOSED NATIONAL RULES AND FORMS AMENDMENTS

The Judicial Conference Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure (Standing Committee) have proposed amendments to their respective rules and forms, and requested that the proposals be circulated to the bench, bar, and public for comment. The public comment period ends February 16, 2023.

### **SCAM ALERT**

In various parts of the United States, including Nevada, citizens are being targeted by phone calls and emails threatening them with prosecution for failing to pay a bond or failing to appear for a hearing or jury service.

In the calls and emails, recipients may be pressured to provide confidential data, potentially leading to identity theft and fraud. The recipients may also be pressured to provide some sort of immediate payment to the caller.

These calls and emails are fraudulent and are not connected with the U.S. Courts. Federal Courts and federal law enforcement do not phone or email individuals with money demands to avoid arrest. If you receive such a call, it is not a legitimate call from the U.S. District Court or U.S. Bankruptcy Court. The court does not require anyone to provide sensitive information or money over the phone or email.
