GETTING IT RIGHT THE FIRST TIME: CM/ECF SELECTION TIPS

When you file documents in CM/ECF, selecting the correct dictionary event is more important than it might seem. Each event can trigger automated actions behind the scenes that affect how a case moves through the court system.

Some CM/ECF events may:

- Set deadlines
- Set internal or external case flags
- Require a filing fee
- Generate statistical reports sent to the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts.

Selecting the incorrect event can lead to delays, confusion on the docket, or even a Notice of Docketing Error (NODE).

If you're unsure whether a specific event exists for your filing, use the Search feature in the CM/ECF ribbon menu bar. Enter a few keywords related to your document, and the system will display matching events so you can select the one that best fits your filing.



**CALLS DEMANDING PAYMENT BY ZELLE, VENMO, OR
PRE-PAID CREDIT CARD**

Bankruptcy Courts across the country are receiving reports that scammers are calling debtors while claiming to represent the Bankruptcy Court. These callers demand payment through services such as Zelle, Venmo, or prepaid credit cards.

Scammers may sound convincing. They often use real court addresses and the names of actual court officials to appear credible. In some cases, they “spoof” caller ID so the call appears to come from a court phone number. Do not provide these callers with any personal information, account numbers, or money.

If you receive one of these calls, hang up immediately and contact the Clerk’s Office. We can look up your case and let you know if any fees are due.

Make all court payments only through Pay.gov, available on our official website. The court does not accept payments through Zelle, Venmo, or credit cards.
