DEPOSIT OR DISBURSEMENT OF INTER-PLEADER FUNDS IN THE COURT'S REGISTRY

In order to comply with IRS regulations, all courts must track "Disputed Ownership Funds" (DOF) for Interpleader Deposits pursuant to 28 U.S.C § 1335. DOF is a fund established to hold money or property subject to conflicting claims of ownership and it is a taxable entity that requires tax administration. Pursuant to Local Rule 7067, filers must deposit interpleader funds in the DOF established within the Court Registry Financial System (CRIS) and administered by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts. The Administrative Office is responsible for meeting all DOF tax administration requirements.

To facilitate the administration of DOFs by the Administrative Office, the following e-filing motion events are available in the Court's Electronic Case Management system (CM/ECF), and MUST be used when depositing and/or requesting disbursement of interpleader funds in the Court's Registry:

- Motion for Interpleader Deposit (28 U.S.C. § 1335)
- Motion for Interpleader Disbursement (28 U.S.C. § 1335)

FREE DOCUMENT ACCESS IN PACER

When you receive a Notice of Electronic Filing email, click the document number to access the document. As a party to the case, you receive one free view of the document for 14 days. After that period expires, standard PACER fees apply.

REMINDER FOR ORDERS

Order titles must clearly state whether relief is granted or denied, and the body of the order must accurately reflect the Court's ruling. The Court may return Orders that do not meet these requirements.



CHAPMOBILE CALENDAR APPLICATION

The United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Nevada offers a free mobile calendar application called ChapMobile, developed by the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of Utah for use by bankruptcy courts nationwide.

ChapMobile gives attorneys, trustees, and parties instant access to public court calendars and 341 hearing schedules — anytime, anywhere. Attorneys practicing in the District of Nevada can also use the application's Attorney Search feature to view their upcoming scheduled hearings.

ChapMobile is available for free for both Apple and Android smartphones and tablets:

- Android devices – Go to [Google Play](#) from your Android device and search for "ChapMobile" to install the app.
- iOS devices – Go to the Apple [App store](#) from your iOS device and search for "ChapMobile" to install the app. (Requires an Apple ID.)
