## **GENERAL ORDER 2020-02**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has advised the general public to take precautions necessary to reduce the possibility of exposure to the coronavirus disease ("COVID-19") outbreak, and slow the spread of the disease. The Governor of the State of Nevada has declared a public health emergency throughout the state in response to the spread of COVID-19 in Nevada, and the President has declared a national emergency. The Court has weighed the right of the public to open access to the court against the need to protect the safety of the public, including the health of all those entering and working in the courthouses.

The Court therefore orders, effective immediately, that the following persons are not permitted to enter the United States District Court for the District of Nevada:

- Persons who have been diagnosed with COVID-19;
- Persons who reside with, or have had contact with, someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days;
- Persons who, because of COVID-19, have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital, or health agency; and
- Persons with apparent symptoms of COVID-19, such as fever, severe cough, or shortness of breath.
