GENERAL ORDER 2022-03 VACATING FIRST AMENDED TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER 2022-01

The Court has issued a series of general orders changing how the Court operates to do its part in containing the spread of COVID-19.¹ In furtherance of those efforts, on February 10, 2022, the Court adopted, and later amended, a Vaccination Policy for employees and externs in response to the COVID-19 pandemic ("the Policy") as part of the Court's gradual transition to living with COVID-19 and resuming normal court operations. See General Order 2022-01. Since then, the Court has incrementally resumed in-person proceedings and expanded jury trials, and recently suspended the face covering requirement for in-person court proceedings. See General Order 2022-02. Nevada Governor Steve Sisolak also recently announced his intention to end the State of Emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic on May 20, 2022.² Thus, by all indications, society and the Court are transitioning to living with COVID-19 from treating it as an emergency. Accordingly, the Court vacates the Policy and the accompanying General Order 2022-01.

That said, COVID-19 continues to circulate in the community, and vaccines remain effective against it.³ The Court continues to encourage all employees and externs to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and stay up-to-date on their vaccinations.

It is therefore ordered that General Order 2022-01, First Amended General Order 2022-01, and the Policy are vacated.

This Order is effective from this 16th Day of May 2022 until further notice.
